



Gorillas have a large toe that works like a thumb. It can grab small objects and open fruit.



There are 2 books, one on gorillas and one on tigers.

Tigers have a rough **tongue** to scrub from off the bones.




It comes in a PowerPoint version as well as a movie version you can use in google slides.




There is a circle map for each animal.


Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions:

- One is errorless
- One has wrong answers mixed in students will have to set aside





There is a matching activity for each animal showing how they have adapated to where they live.




There is a Venn Diagram to compare gorillas and tigers.

It comes with a color-coded version (shown here.)

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b. Hands and feet

There is an assessment at the end of each week, on that animal.

There are 3 versions.

- 10 questions with 3 picture choices for each question


