

Every unit in the bundle comes with a vocabulary board. These are vital for increasing engagement and participation. Suggestions on how to utilize them are included in each unit.

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


In 1954, in a famous court case the Supreme Court ruled again that segregation in public schools was against the law.



The history units come with a book with engaging photos and simple text. There is a voice-recorded PowerPoint presentation as well as a movie version that you can play on Google Classroom.

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


The history units come with activities to review points covered in the book, as well as a lesson plan.



The novel unit (although not about black history) is by a black author who writes about life in the inner city, which is told in a series of poems. It has 21 activities and chapter questions.


