



#### Preparation


- · Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit

Vocabulary boards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

Tips on how to use in the unit!!

What makes something a desert? Deserts are areas that get very little precipitation. There will be less than 10 inches of rain that falls each year.

Dust storms are not uncommon in the desert, and can be very dangerous. Strong winds will pull up the sand, gravel and small pebbles from the ground up into the air. These storms can be over a mile high and travel more than 1000 miles. The air can be so thick with dirt that you would be unable to breathe.



There is a 41-page book with simple text and engaging photos.

It comes in a PowerPoint version as well as a voice-recorded PowerPoint (so you don't have to print it out.)
There is also a movie version you can use in google slides.

Common storm in the desert where wind blows up sand and dirt into the air.


Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions:

There is a Venn diagram comparing nonpolar and polar deserts. This uses facts from the book. There is a colorcoded option included (shown here).











There is a writing prompt about going on an adventure in the desert. This is an errorless activity and gives students a chance to write their own stories with support.




#### Who am I cards

- · Give each student a set of Who am I cards
- · Various options/ways to play, but the goal is to have students hold up the card you are talking about. Sometimes there can be more than one correct answer
- · Things you can do:
  - · Hold up a vocabulary card
  - · Show a page from the book
  - · Point to a symbol on the vocabulary board
  - · Verbally describe something about the tundra.
- · Tell a story as though you were visiting the tundra.
  - What do you see?
  - · What is the weather like?
  - · What plants or animals do you see?
  - · Where do you live?
  - · What are you eating?


# Bingo cards
