

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

Preparation


- · Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit















































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
This unit comes with a vocabulary board.

Vocabulary boards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

Tips on how to use in the unit!!



The understory is the middle layer and contains smaller trees, saplings, and shrubs. The floor is where you find mosses, ferns, flowers, and mushrooms. We will look at each of these layers more closely in each type of forest including which animals live in each layer.





Most of the trees in these temperate forests are deciduous, which means they lose their leaves each fall. The trees also use sap to keep the roots from freezing in the winter and to deliver nutrients and energy.



There is a 43-page book with simple text and engaging photos.

It comes in a PowerPoint version as well as a voice-recorded PowerPoint (so you don't have to print it out.)
There is also a movie version you can use in google slides.

























Bingo cards




- · Included are 10 Bingo cards in color and 10 Bingo cards in BW.

- Cut one board apart to use as calling cards.
- . This is a great way to practice the new vocabulary included in this unit.
- · Cut apart a set of the vocabulary cards to use as the calling cards.
- Options:
 - · Show students the picture for them to match
 - Read the definition and see if students can find the matching picture
 - · Work as teams
 - · Vary the "winning" patterns.
 - Cover all
 - · Cover corners
 - · Row across or down
 - · Cover the edges
 - Vary the ways to mark the card
 - · Place in page protector or laminate and use dry erase markers
 - Stickers


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




Calling cards included
