# Great Depression Lesson Plan

#### Preparation

- · Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit
  - Laminate or place in page protector
- · Book (there are 2 versions to choose from; easy and challenging)
  - o Print out, laminate, and bind
  - OR your students can listen to the pre-recorded version
- Vocabulary cards
  - Print out a set of cards onto cardstock and laminate
  - Make one set for each student and also one for the teacher to use in 1 Spy games
- · Print the large timeline cards on cardstock and laminate.

Preassessment (do day 1 before starting lesson)

- Choose the form of the assessment that best fits the learning level of your students
- · Give the assessment to assess what your students may already know
- I cannot emphasize enough how important this step is. If you want to see growth, this preassessment is so important!!

- Color Coding: this is a really easy way to add more structure to a matching activity. Outline or color in an empty box or sorting label. Outline or color in the corresponding picture symbols the same colors. Becomes a color matching task.



Read or listen to a recording of the book (15 minutes)	<ul> <li>Read through the story, asking lots of questions</li> <li>Continue to make connections between book and vocabulary board</li> </ul>	Book     Vocabulary     board
Vocabulary cards <mark>Speed</mark> Matching (10 minutes)	<ul> <li>place all the cards in the middle of the table</li> <li>hold up a card, and the students race to find it in the pile in the middle of the table         <ul> <li>NOTE: for students with physical challenges, allow them to simply find the symbol on their board or communication device</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Vocabulary cards (extra sets)
Large Timeline Cards (10 minutes)	<ul> <li>Pass the cards out to the students and have them arrange themselves in the correct order         <ul> <li>You can put index cards with the date on the floor ahead of time, so they just have to find the card that matches the date on their flashcard</li> </ul> </li> <li>Have each student step forward as you talk about their card</li> </ul>	• Large cards























This unit comes with a vocabulary board.

# **Black Tuesday**

- On October 29, 1929 the stock market "crashed."
- People who had invested in the stock market lost \$14 billion dollars that day.
- Over the next 4 days, investors lost \$30 billion dollars.
- This was the start of the Great Depression.



There are 2 versions of the book included. One has much more text and detail. The other is much simpler. You can use either one to complete the related activities.




October 29, 1929 The biggest one-day loss in the stock market.

### discrimination


Treat someone unfairly because they are different than you are. Based on the color of their skin, where they were born, or gender.



Businesses and things all people use to live and travel.





There are 18 vocabulary cards that come in color and black and white.

On days 6 & 7 there is an activity where students will match either the picture to the definition or the definition to the picture (harder).






There is a circle map.

- One has wrong answers mixed in students will have to set aside








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There are 11 large timeline cards. Included are suggestions of how to use these as a daily group activity.






Christa Joy, Special Needs for Special Kids

Answer key included.




With this version, you cut out the answer choices and glue them on index cards. Ask the student the question, and they point to the correct answer.
