Onomatopoeia Unit Lesson Plan

Preparation

 - o Print out a set of cards onto cardstock and laminate
 - Make one set for each student and one for the teacher to use in various games

Preassessment (do day 1 before starting lesson)


















































This unit comes with a vocabulary board.

Vocabulary boards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.


Tips on how to use in the unit!!

Normally onomatopoeia uses real words like how' woof, and snarl.






It comes in a PowerPoint version as well as a movie/mp4 file (so you don't have to print it out.)


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Onomatopoeia Examples

The kitten purred as she slurped up the milk.








He guzzled the soda and let out a loud burp.


