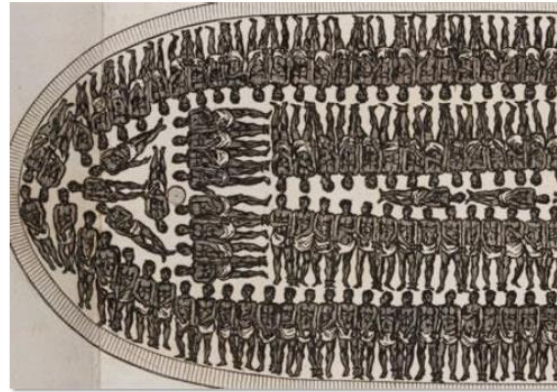

About 100,000 slaves escaped using the **Underground Railroad** between 1810-1865.

Over 600,000 slaves were brought across the Atlantic ocean to the American colonies. Many Native Americans living in America were also made slaves by the colonists.

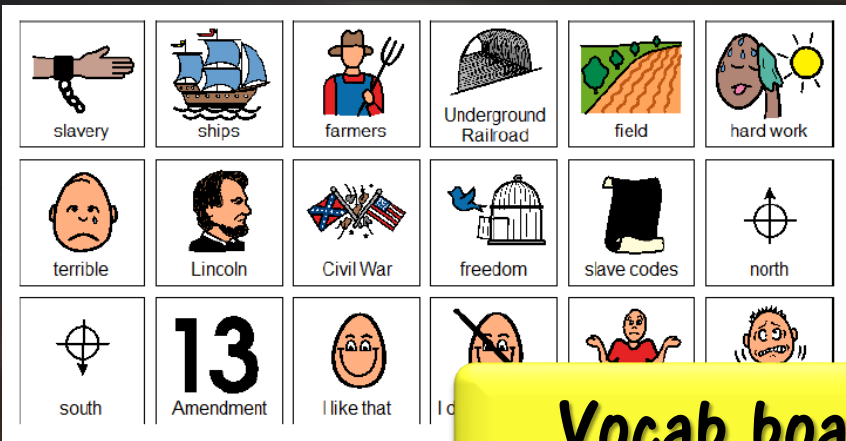


Slaves often slept in small barns and sheds and were given scraps of food to eat. They were often beaten with whips and chained up if the farm owner felt they had done something wrong. Many, many slaves ended up dying on these farms.



Although slavery is gone in the United States, there is still a struggle for equal rights for ALL Americans.
