

Lobbying and Special Interest Groups Lesson Plan for High School

Preparation

- · Print out a vocabulary board for each student to use throughout unit
 - Laminate or place in page protector
- Books
 - Print out, laminate, and bind
 - o OR your students can listen to the pre-recorded version
- Vocabulary cards
 - o Print out a set of cards onto cardstock and laminate
 - Make one set for each student and also one for the teacher to use in 1 Spy

Preassessment (do day 1 before starting lesson)

- · Choose the form of the assessment that best fits the learning level of your students
- Give the assessment to assess what your students may already know
- . I cannot emphasize enough how important this step is. If you want to see growth, this preassessment is so important!!

Teaching Tips

- 1. Color Coding. this is a really easy way to add more structure to a matching activity. Outline or color in an empty box or sorting label. Outline or color in the corresponding picture symbols the same colors. Becomes a color matching task.

Some special interest groups are economic interest groups. Their primary concern is to help businesses, professionals, labor industries, and the farming industry make as much money as possible.



Next, are labor special interest groups. The members of this group are looking to help the individual workers rather than the business as a whole. They want their workers to be safe and be paid well.



There are consumer special interests groups that also serve the public interest. These groups are focused on making sure things that we buy are safe and will not cause harm.



Lobbying takes a lot of time, money, and sometimes even a fancy commercial in order to get noticed.
