Tips on how to use in the unit!!

Let's talk about **narrative** style first. In this type of style, the writer is telling the story through a main character.



Expository style is the opposite of **persuasive** style. With persuasive style of writing, the author is trying to convince the reader of something.



There is a book with this unit using simple text and photos. It is 34 pages and goes through the different types of styles authors use.

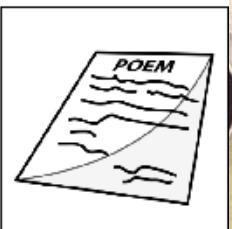
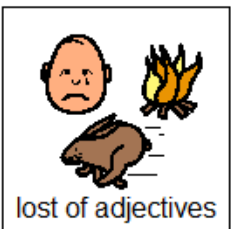
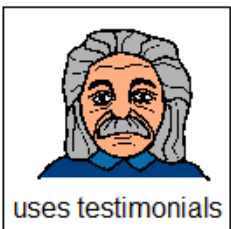
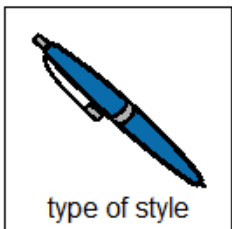
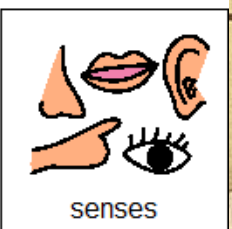
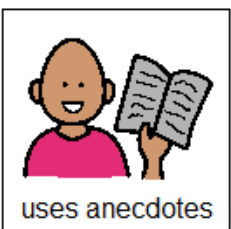
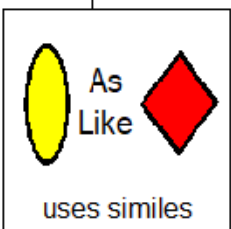
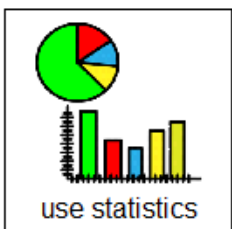
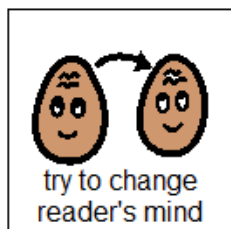
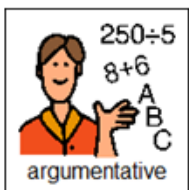
Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions:
