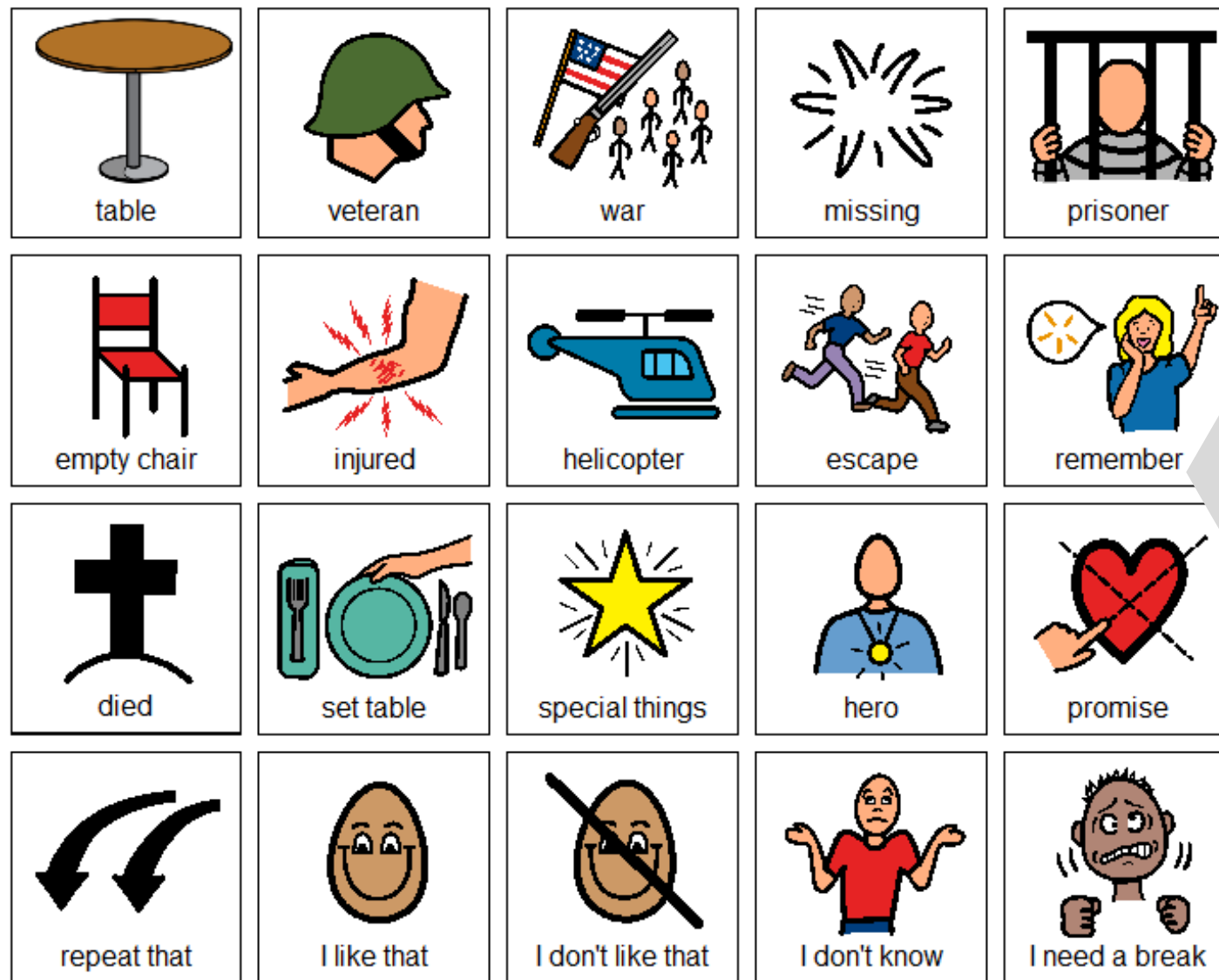
This unit has **34 pages plus 12 google slides.**

There are 2 circle maps. This one is on what a hero looks like. It comes with 2 choices:

An errorless option with only correct answers

An option that has wrong answers mixed in students will need to set aside.

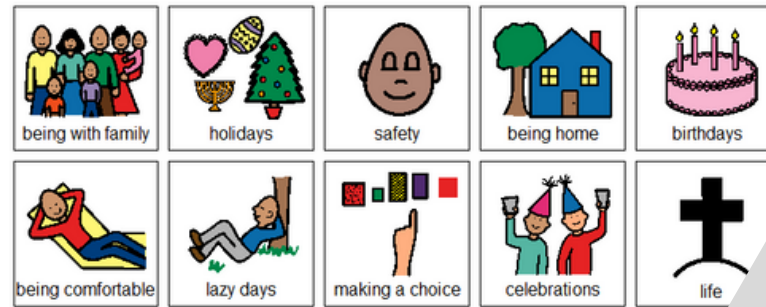


What sacrifices to soldiers make?

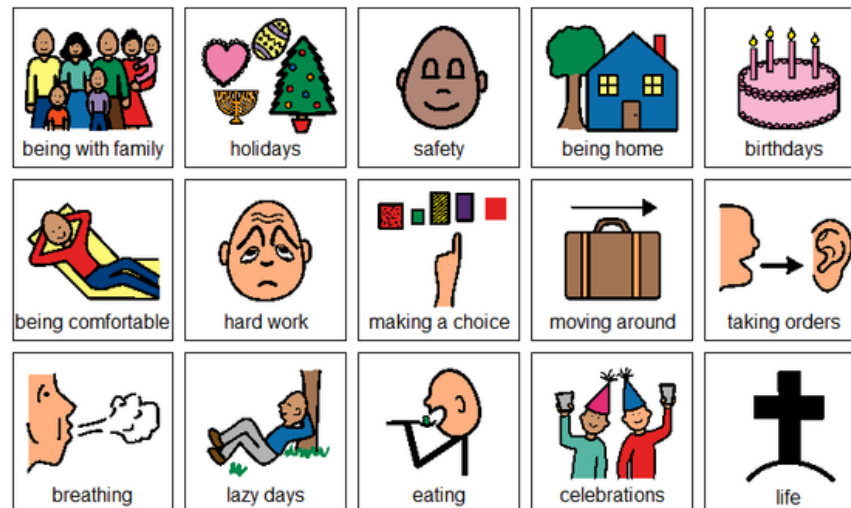


Errorless version

Place the pictures in the circle map on previous page showing sacrifices soldiers make.

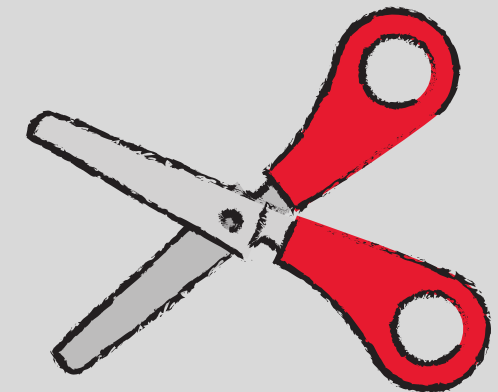


Place the pictures in the circle map on previous page **ONLY IF** you think it is a sacrifice a soldier would have to make.

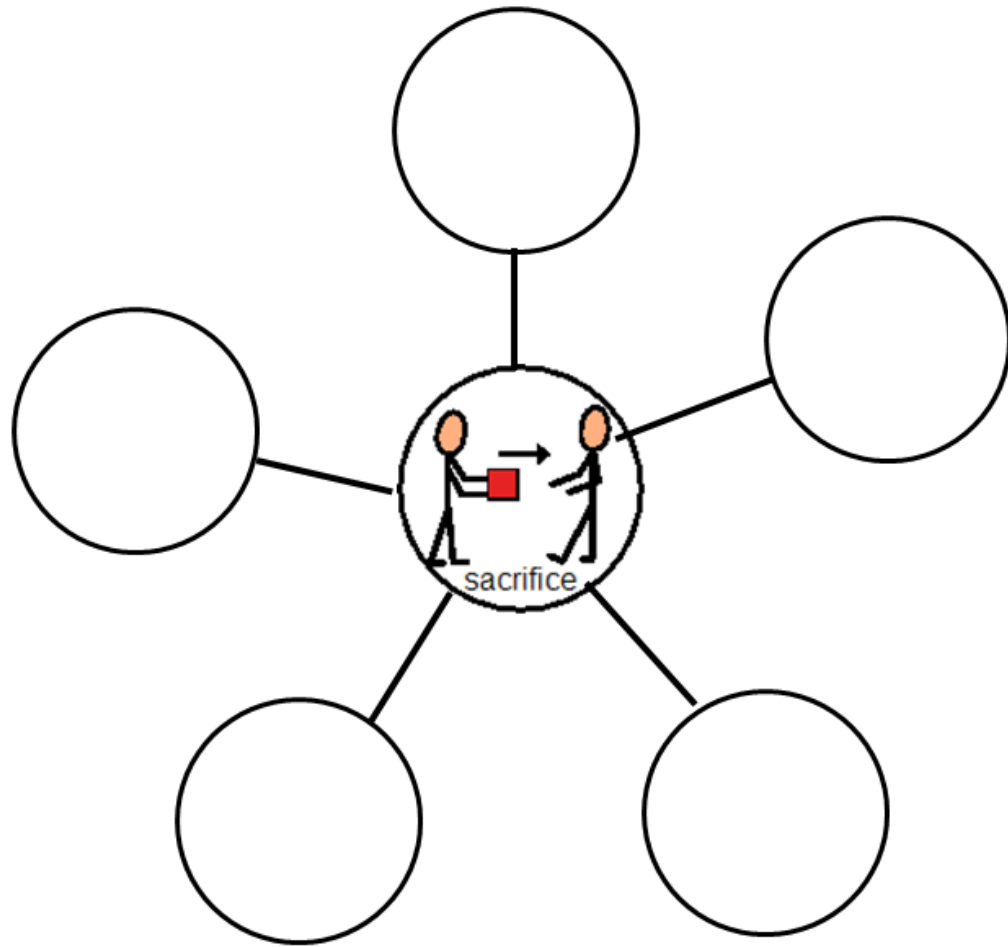

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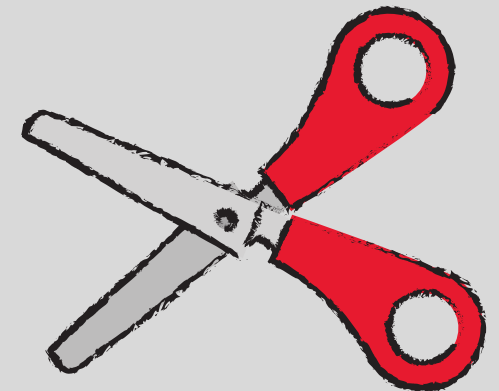
This circle map has students think about the sacrifices soldiers have to make. There are the same errorless and non-errorless options included.

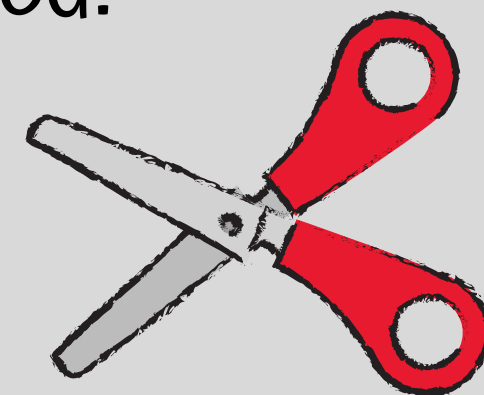

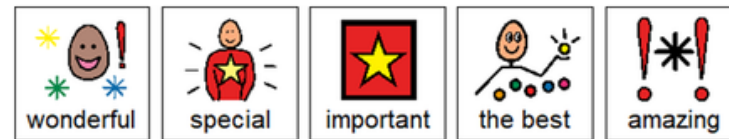
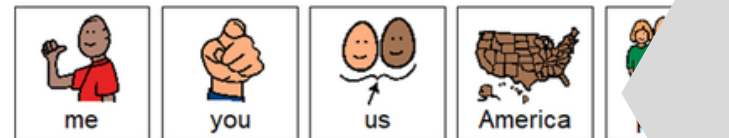
I am thankful to veterans who fought in the .

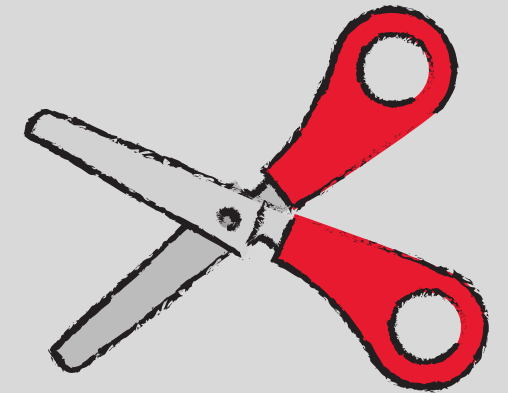

There is a writing prompt for students to complete about what they are thankful to veterans for.

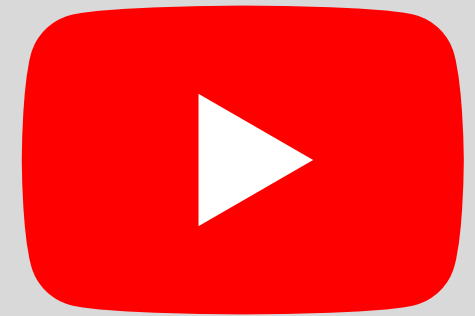
This is an errorless activity that allows students to write a story independently.



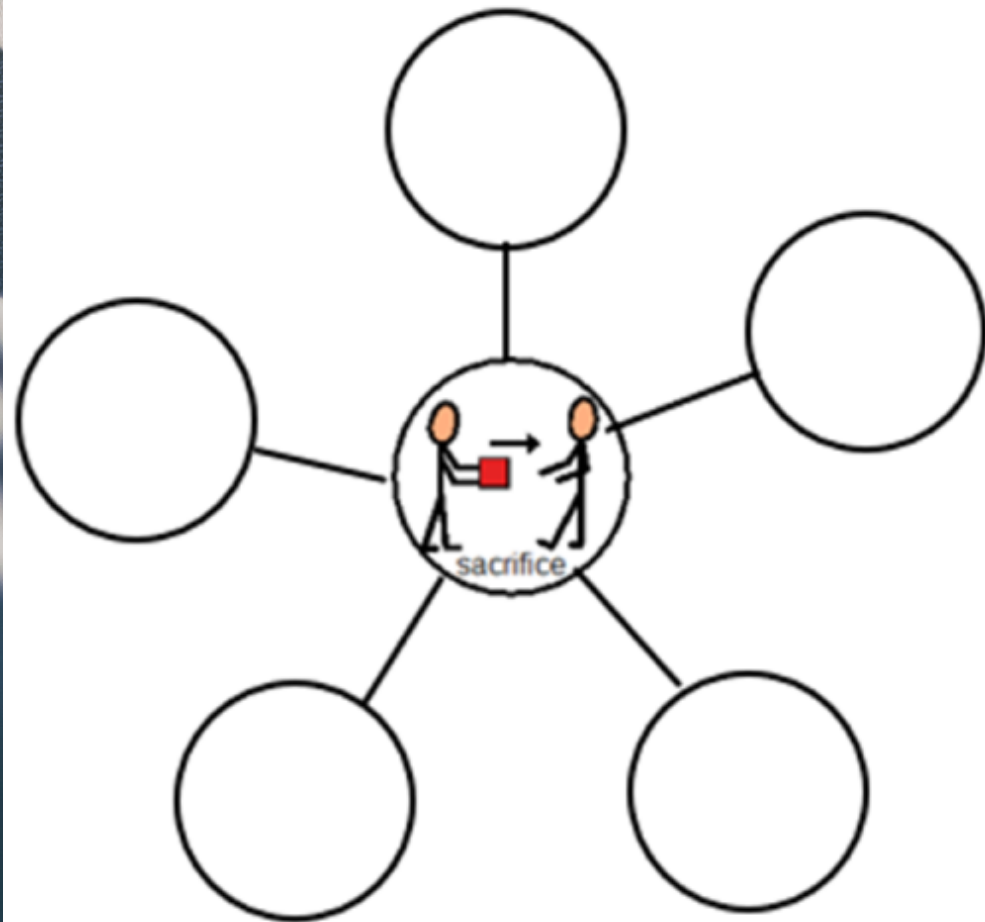

Place the pictures below in the empty circle to show what the word sacrifice means.











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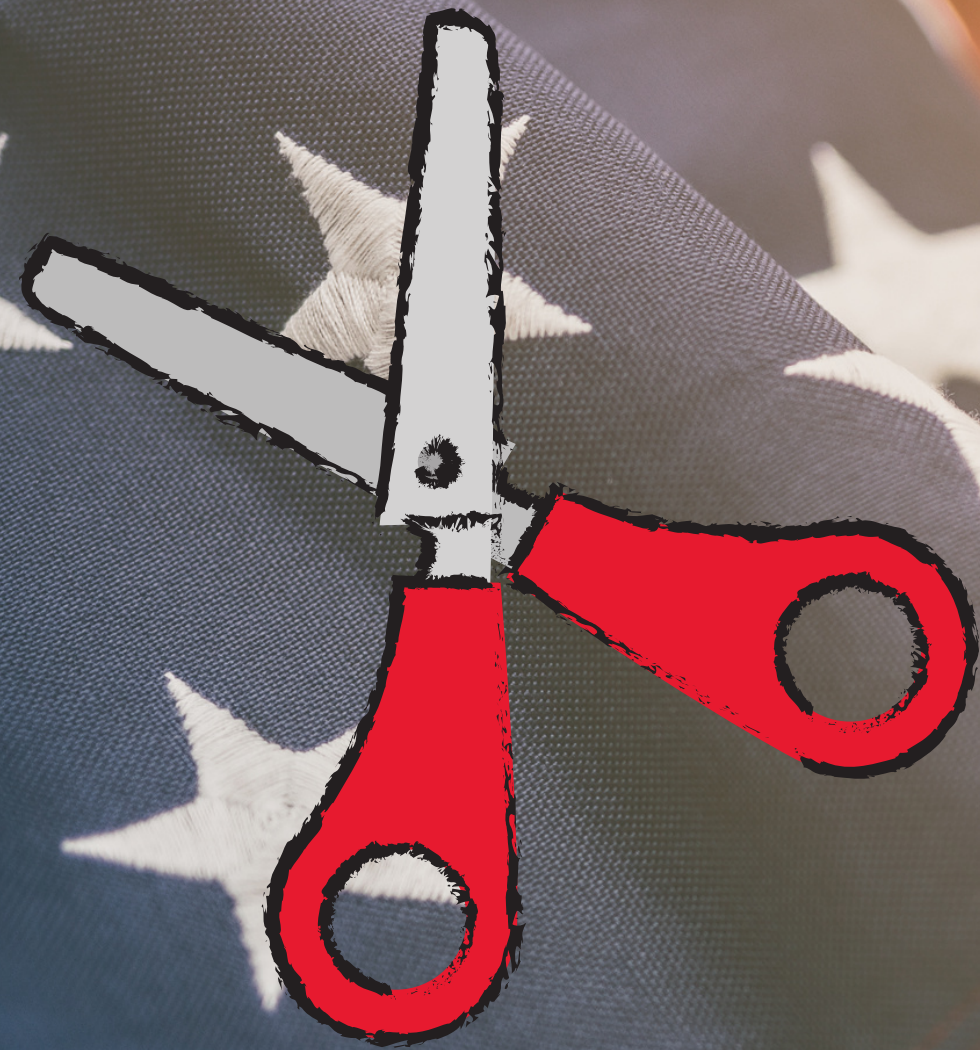
