This unit comes with a storyboard.

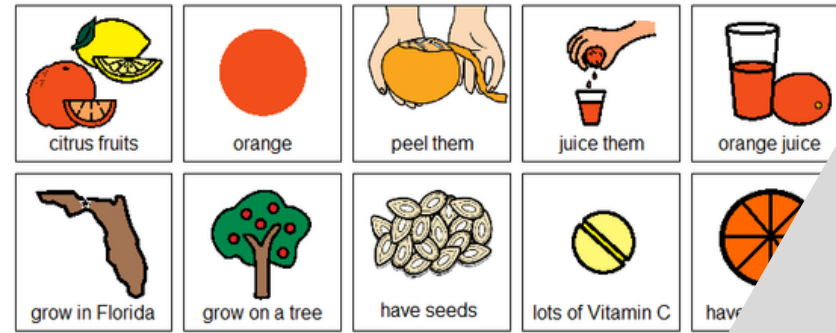
Storyboards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

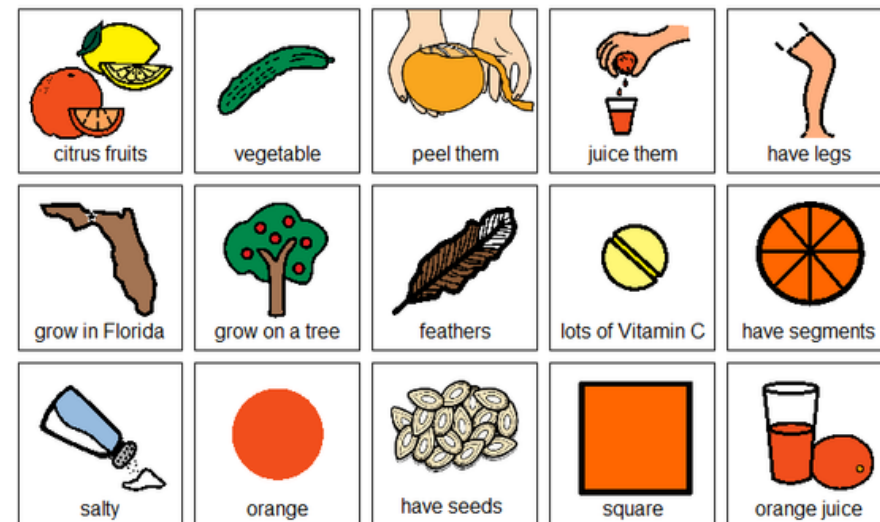

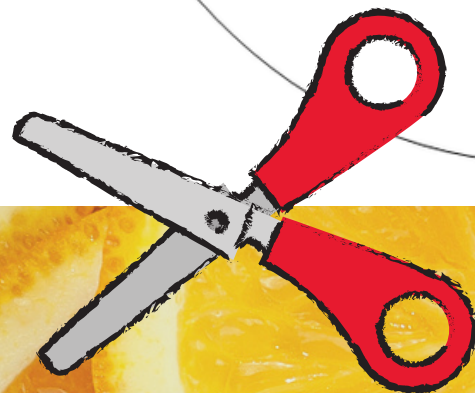

Place the following on the previous page **ONLY IF** they are true about oranges.











There is a circle map looking at different facts about oranges. There is an option that only has correct answers and one that has wrong answers mixed in.



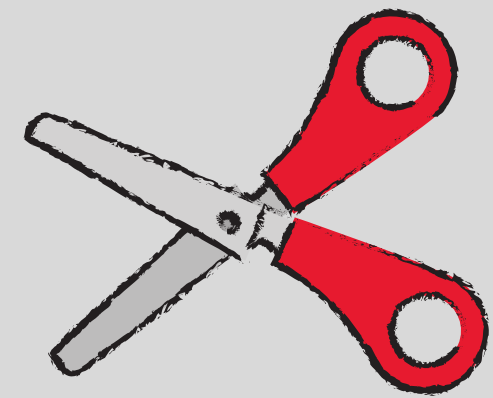
Match the correct set of oranges you would need to so each kid gets one orange.

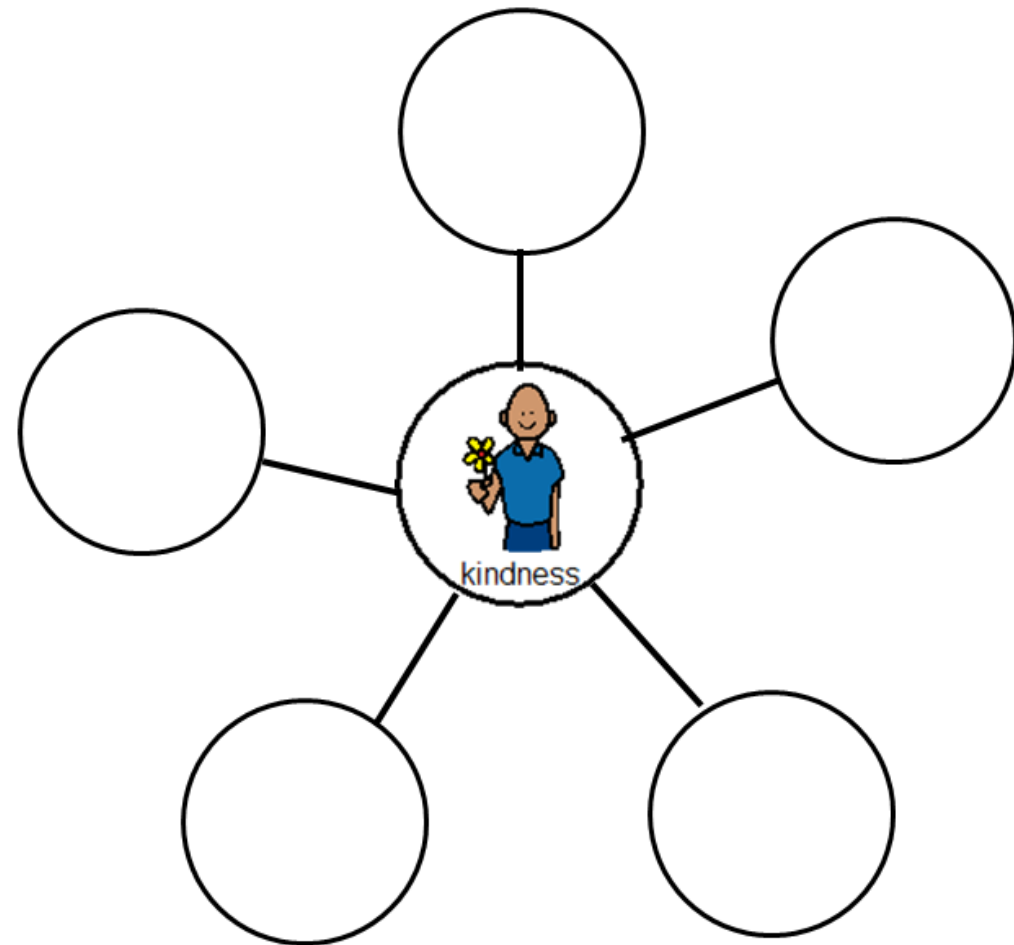

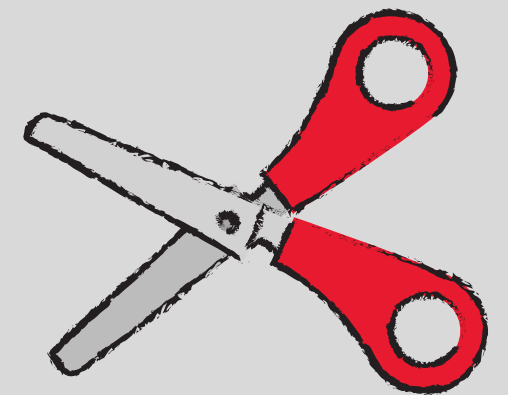
Students will match the number of oranges to each group of people. This is great for 1:1 correspondence.



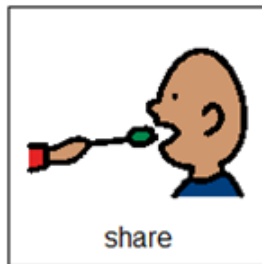
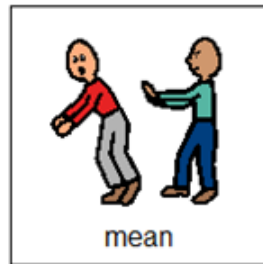
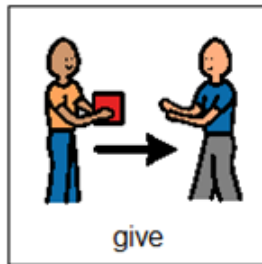
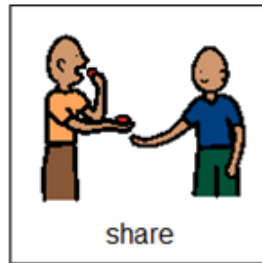
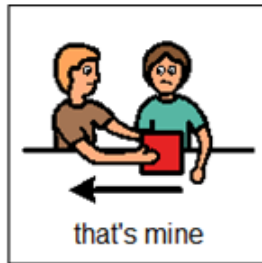
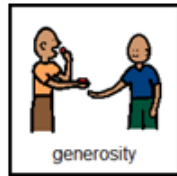
What are some acts of kindness?



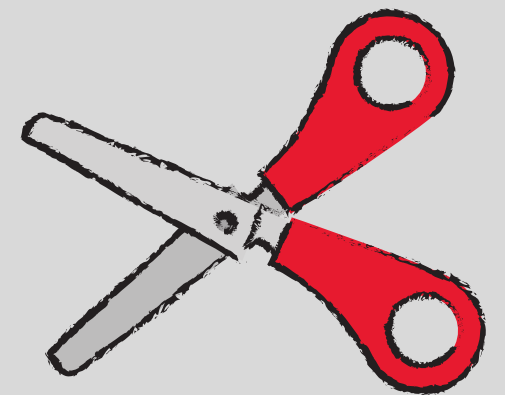
Students will explore different acts of kindness. This is an errorless activity.
