


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Harold plans to treat Bunnicula's illness with salad. Match the best medicine for each injury on the left.



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For example, in chapter 7, Harold plans to take care of Bunnicula by getting him some salad. In this activity, students will match the best cure to each illness. It comes with a differentiated version where students can trace the line.

Suggestions for Use

- I made this unit to go along with the book, *Bunnicula* by Deborah and James Howe.
- The thought is that you would be reading it aloud to your class at a rate of about 1 chapter per day.
- Be sure to give each student their own copy of the story board (pg. 7) to use while reading and discussing the story.
- Benefits of reading out loud, even to classes made up of severely affected students:
 - Teaches students to sit quietly even when there isn't something for them to do. This is such an important life skill. We all have to spend time sitting and listening to someone we are not that interested in at some point.
 - Parents will LOVE you. Not only will they be excited their child is being exposed to age appropriate material, but you are teaching them how to sit quietly, which will hopefully transfer to home as well.
 - Even with your lowest level learners, you will have 1 or 2 that will truly enjoy the story.
 - It can be a calming experience to sit and listen to the teacher read in a methodical way.





Suggestions for Use


- For students who need more structure, plar number of post-it notes in front of him/he corresponds to the number of pages you read. Remove a post-it as you finish each visual will help lessen their anxiety.
- You will find 2 or more activities for each chewill still have plenty to choose from and find the fit best with your students.
- Differentiation:
 - For any activity, you can quickly differentiate for your lower level learners by using a color coding technique.
 - If sorting, outline each sorting category a certain color and them outline the corresponding pictures the same color.
 - · Becomes a matching task.
- This unit does include comprehension questions in a separate file. There are 5 multiple choice questions for each chapter. An answer key is included.

Suggestions on how I found this activity worked best in my classroom are provided. I typically had 6-8 students with one adult assistant in the room with me.




Vocabulary boards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

Place the following pictures in the circle map on the previous page showing things that rabbits eat.


























Place the following pictures in the circle map on the previous page ONLY if they are things rabbits would eat.
































Circle maps are a great way for students to see the big idea.




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Each circle map comes with 2 choices:

Smelly/Not Smelly Sort: Cut apart the pictures and sort into correct column on previous page. If you are not sure, place it on the middle line.






















