



Give the Pig Some Pancakes Directions

Preparation


 Print out pictures on card stock or mount on construction paper and laminate for durability


Directions for Use

 There are 2 copies of pancakes and syrup as the story repeats itself at the end






Pig a Pancake Associations

- Set-up
 - Print out sorting labels and put at the top of 2 pieces of construction paper
- Directions
 - Students cut apart pictures and sort into 2 groups
- Differentiation
 - Color one label and corresponding pictures a the same color to provide more visual support

Sorting Labels










Which is taller? Directions
