
Storyboards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

Errorless Option


Place the following pictures in the circle map on the previous page showing some common things about fairy tales.




Look at the following pictures and place the correct choices in the circle map on the previous page **ONLY IF** they are true about most fairy tales.



There is a circle map showing things about fairy tales. There is an option that only has correct answers and one that has wrong answers mixed in.




