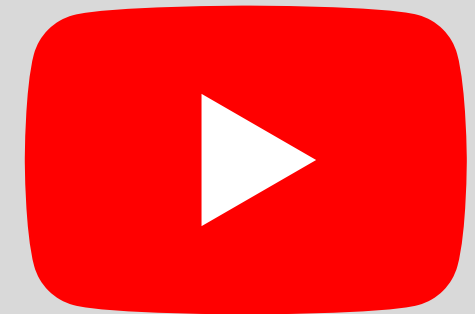
Students will write a story about having a St. Patrick's Day feast. This is an errorless activity that allows students to write their own story independently.
