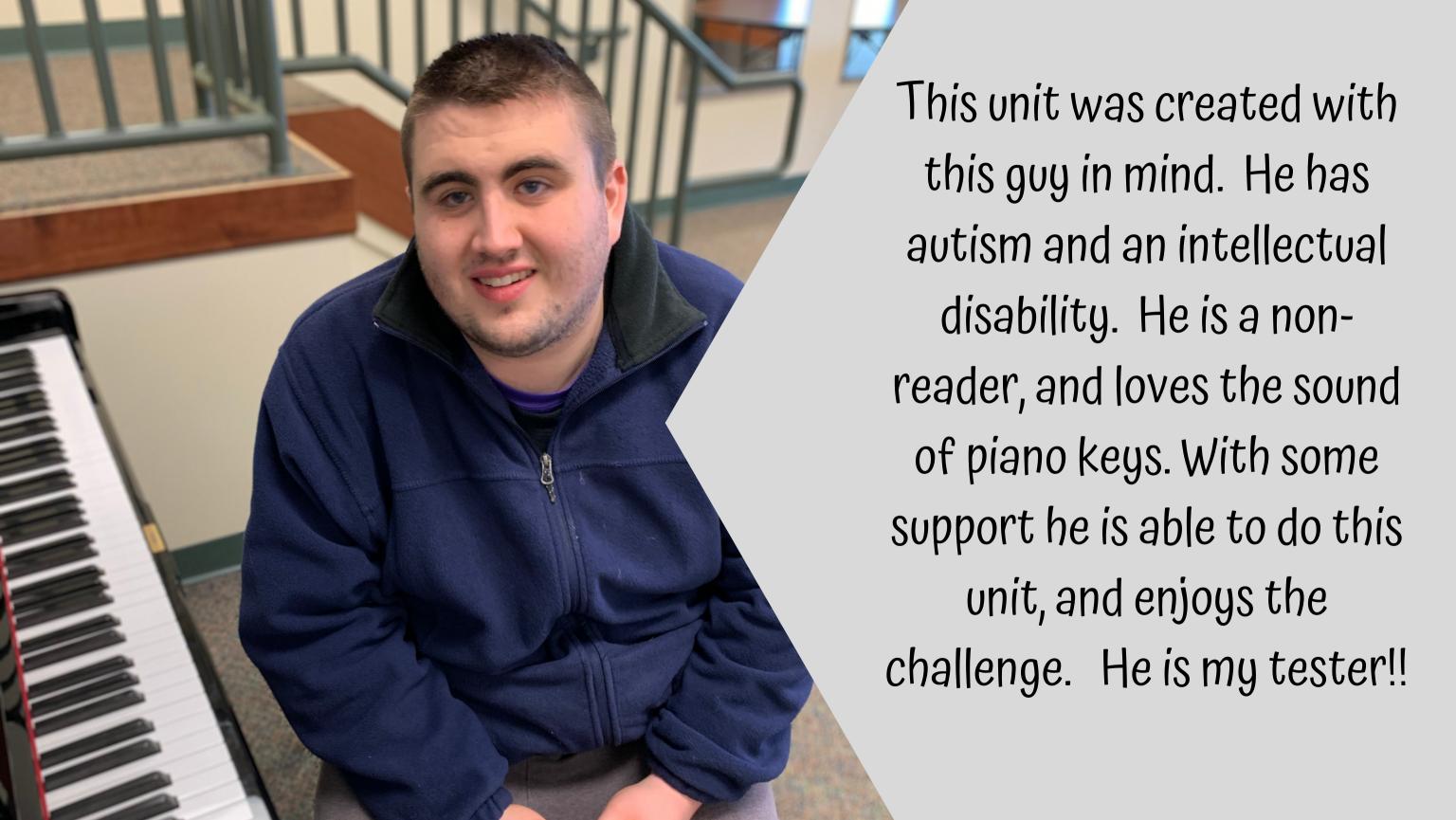

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

Preparation

 - o OR your students can listen to the pre-recorded version

Preassessment (do day 1 before starting lesson)

- · Choose the form of the assessment that best fits the learning level of your students
- Give the assessment to assess what your students may already know



Sharing (10 minutes)	 Each student shares their worksheet with the group using the communication method of their choice 	Completed worksheetCommunication




There is a 29-page book with simple text and engaging photos.

Each region was different and had different natural resources.




Some regions had forests.

Cut pictures out relating to Native Americans and place in circle map.





















































































Circle maps are a great way for students to see the concept at a glance. There are 2 versions:

HOMES IN DIFFERENT REGION Move the pictures and place them in the correct region the map.








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Each activity is set up so students can click and drag answers. No typing is required.
