This unit has 6 activities to go with this book to last a full week of instruction.

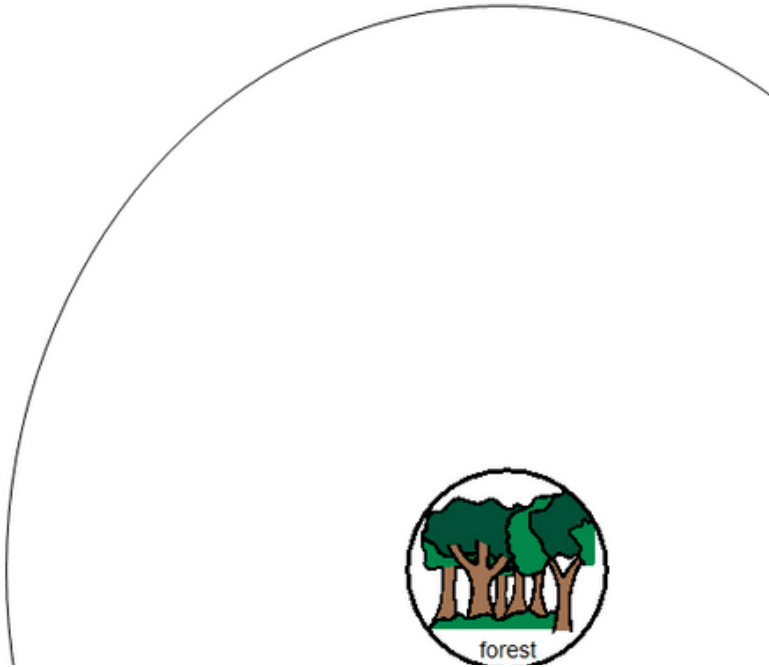
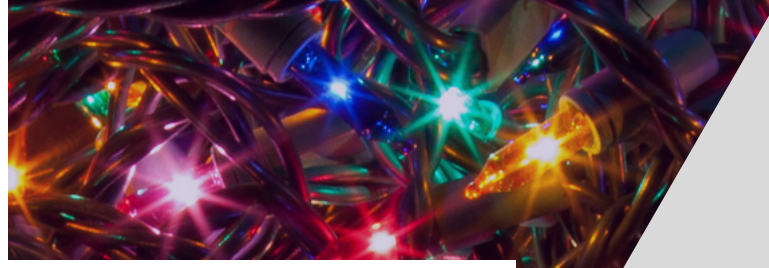


This unit comes with a storyboard.

Storyboards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

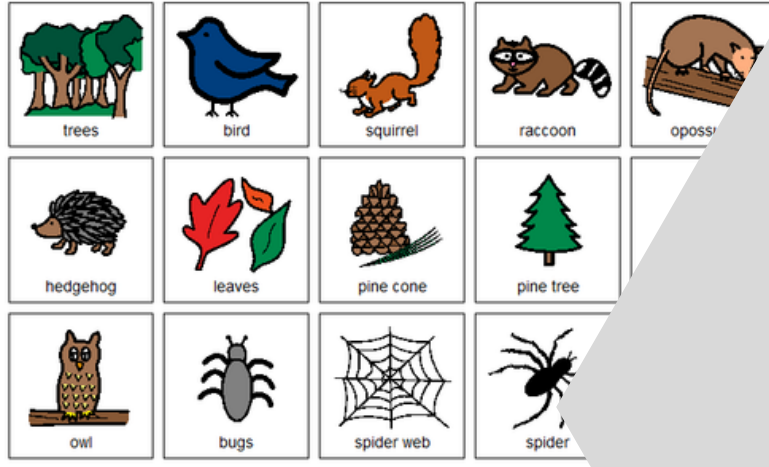
Tips on how to use in the unit!!

Some drinks are served hot and some are served. Sort the drinks on the next page into the correct column.

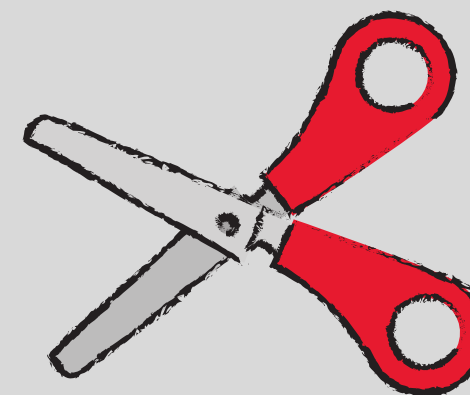


Some drinks are served hot and some are served. Sort the drinks on the next page into the correct column.

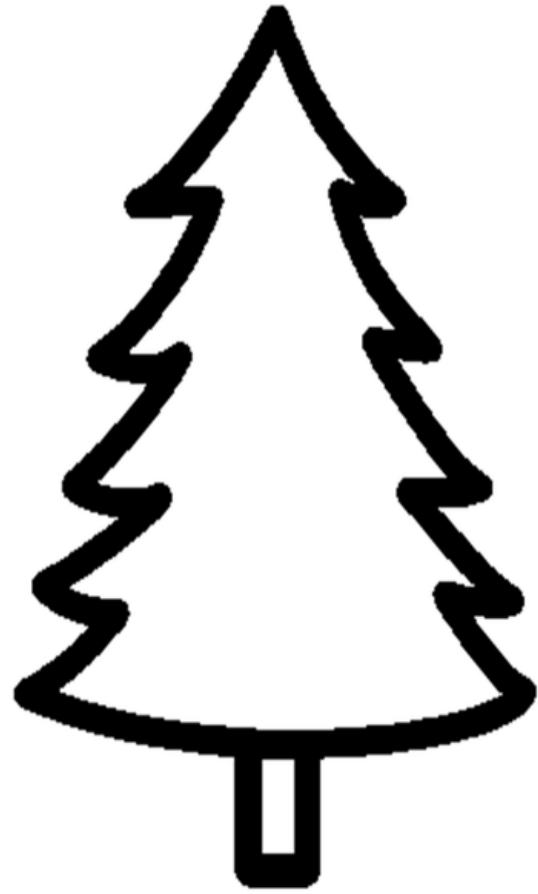


Students will sort drinks that are hot (like the hot chocolate in the story), and ones that are cold.

My Holiday Tree



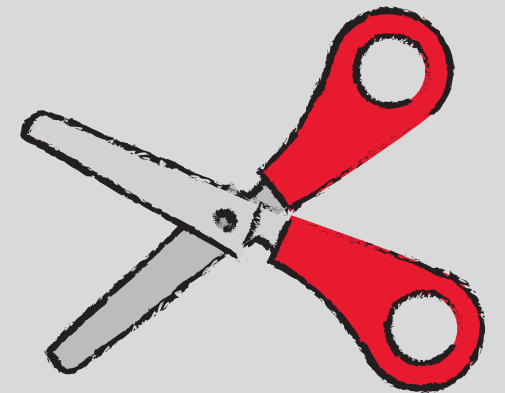
Choose some of the items below to put on your holiday tree.



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Students will get to decorate a tree using symbols provided or other art materials.



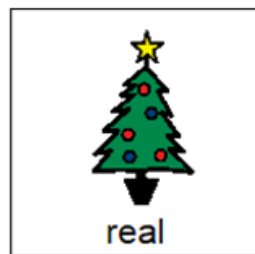
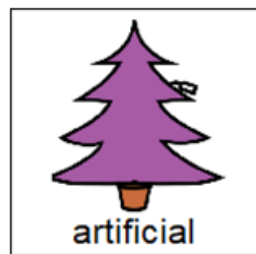
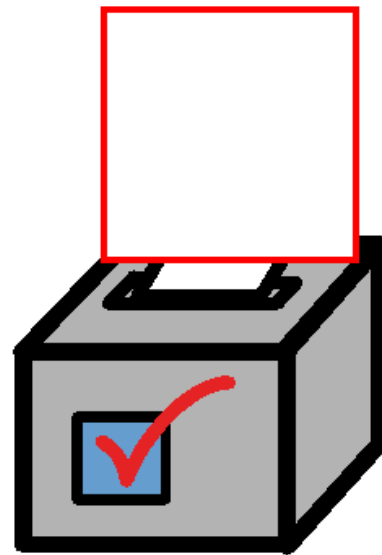
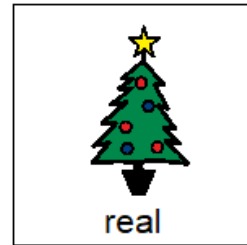
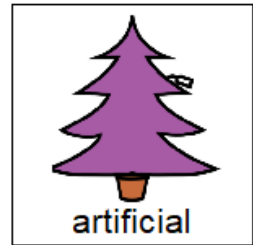
Count how many of each object is on the tree.

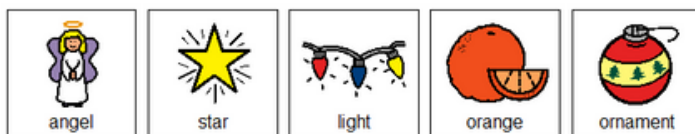

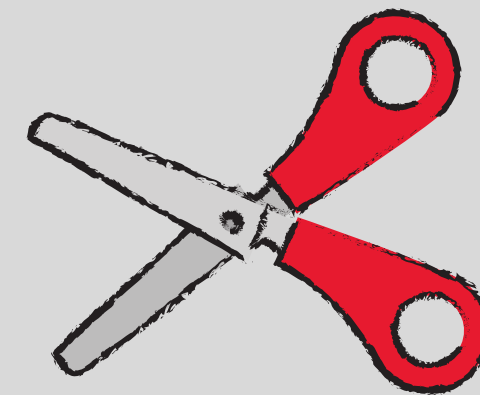

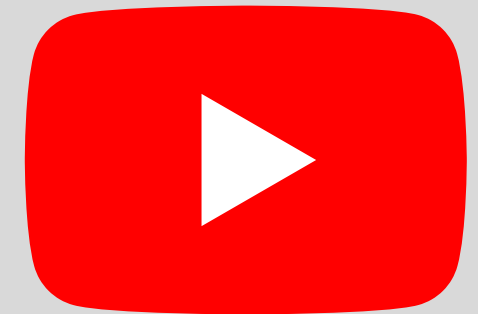
Students will write a story about decorating a tree. This is an errorless task and a great way for students to write a story independently.
