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There is a 10 page social story that has simple text and engaging photos. This story is in a PowerPoint and Google Slide format so you **can edit** the text if needed to fit your own situation.

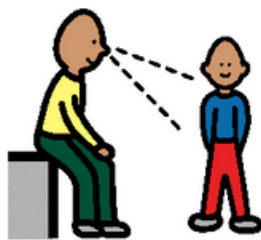
When I see someone I know it is nice to say "hi."

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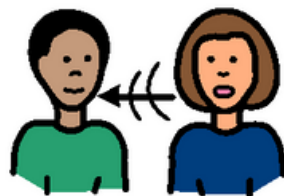
When I say "hi" I should try to:

Page 2

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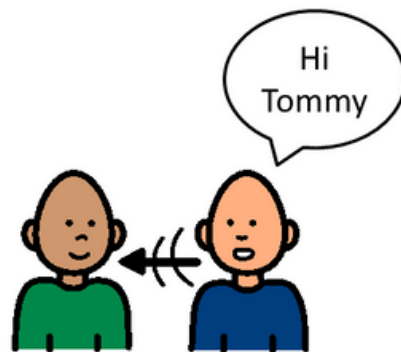
2. Say "hello" in a friendly, soft voice.

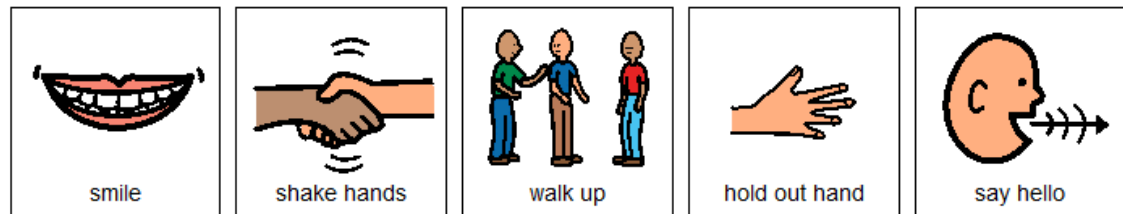
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There is also a 11 page booklet in color and black and white that students can keep with them and take home to review as needed.

You may want to have your students role play this to determine what feels like the best sequence of events for them.

There is a sequencing activity. Students can act out the steps to see what feels most natural to them. Suggestions for differentiation are included.

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There is a power card that comes in 2 versions that reviews the steps when saying hello. These are great for students to carry around and personalize.

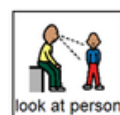
