
This unit has 40 pages plus 16 google slides. There are 6 activities to go with this book as well as a storyboard to use for group discussions.





















































This unit comes with a storyboard.

Complete the circle map below to show what bravery looks like. Remember being brave does NOT mean you are not scared.




There is a circle map. It comes with 2 choices:










Real or Imaginary?















































There is a sorting activity where students sort things that are real vs those that are imaginary.



There is a Venn diagram where students compare human friends vs imaginary friends. There is a color-coded option included (shown here).









There is a maze where students help Beekle find his friend Alice. There is a differentiated version with a line for students to trace if needed.




