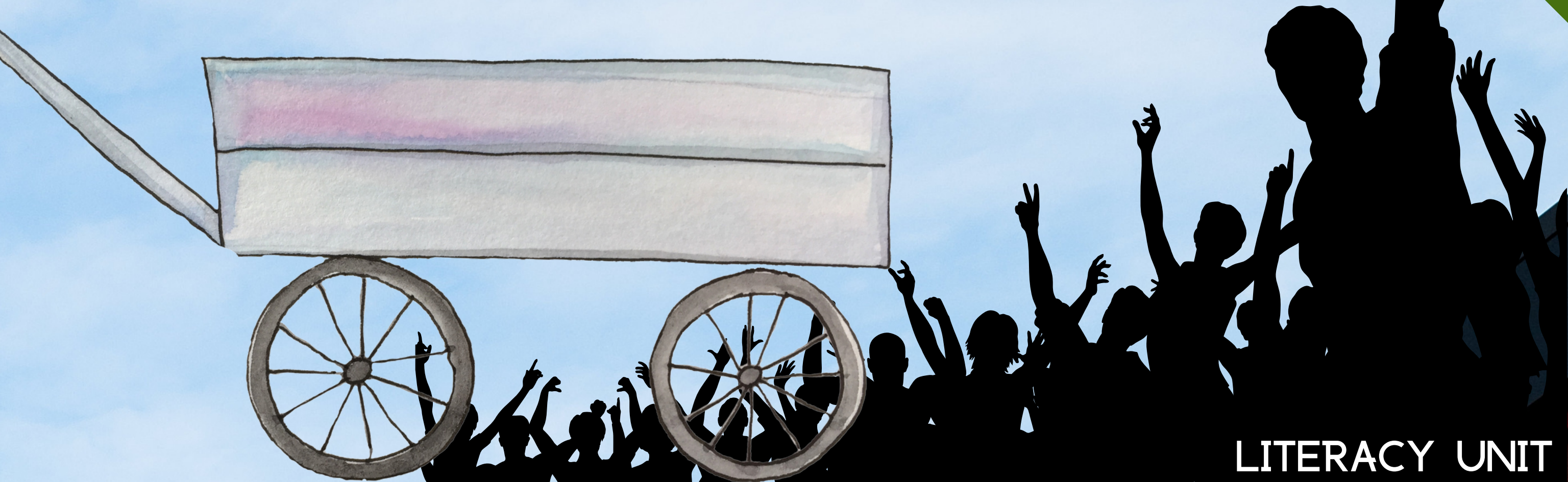

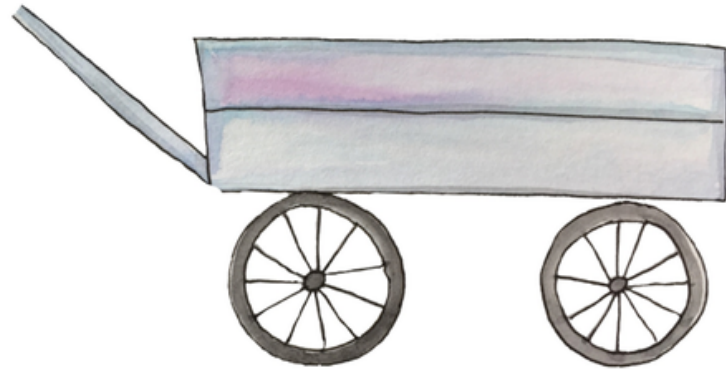

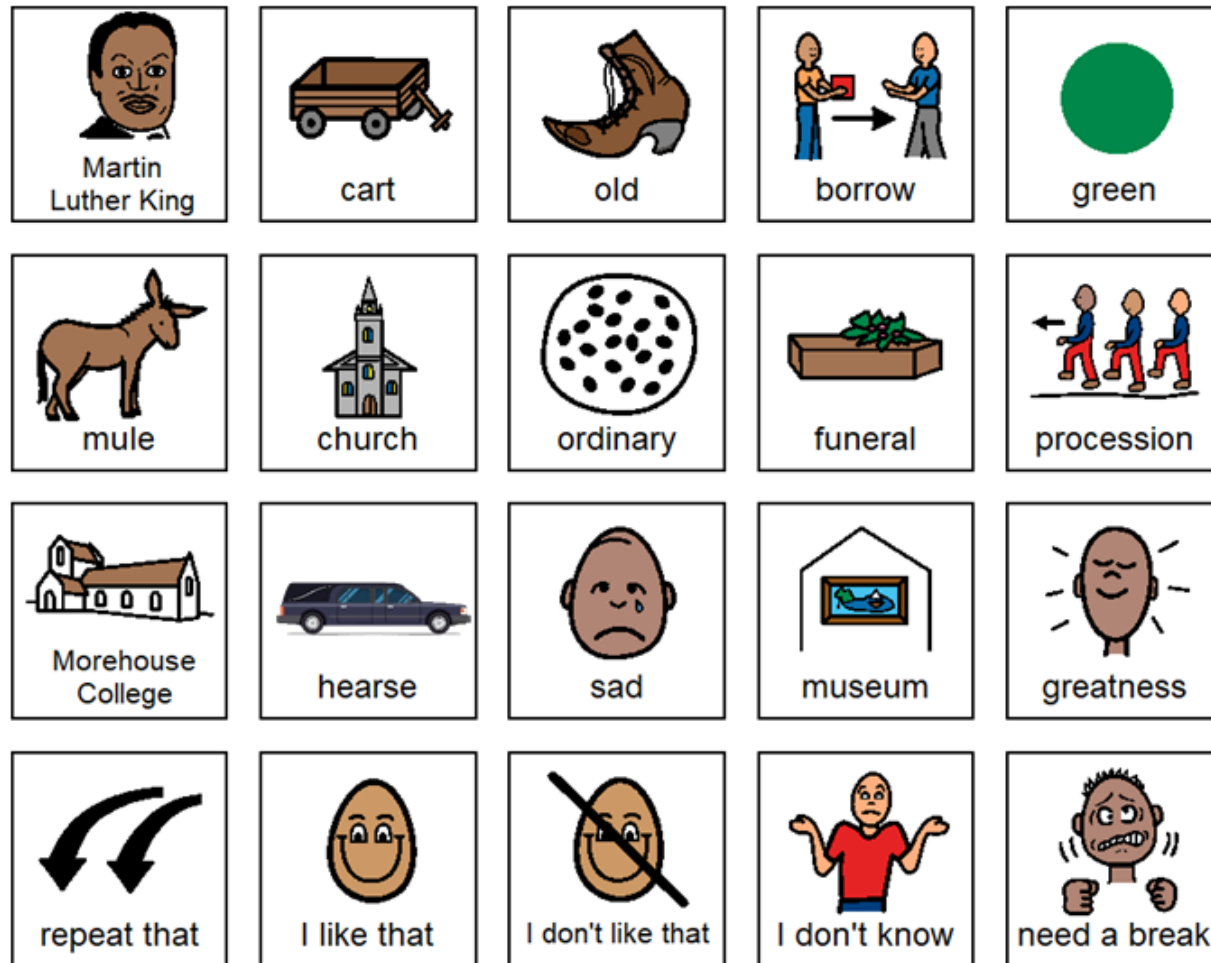
This unit has **30 pages plus 10 google slides**. There are 6 activities to go with this book to last a full week or more of instruction.

Storyboards are great for ALL students to assist with participation and engagement in group discussions.

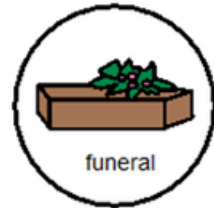
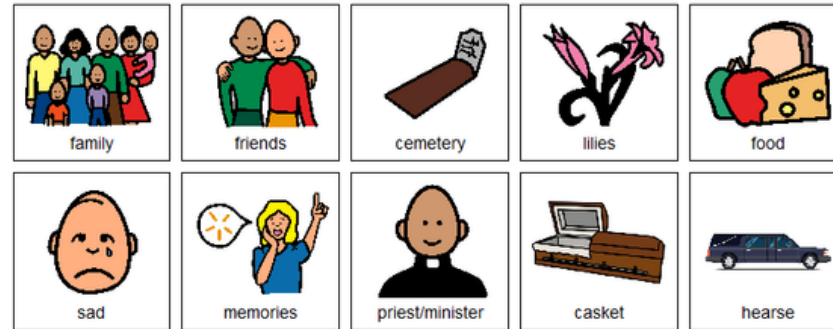

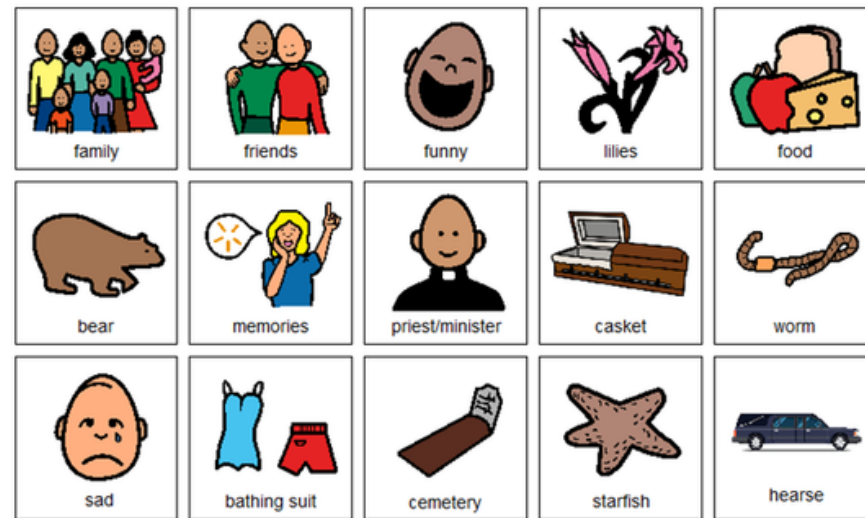
What are some things you are likely to find or feel at a funeral?

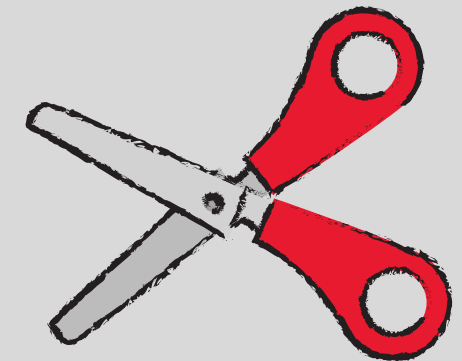
Place the pictures in the circle map on previous page showing things at a funeral.



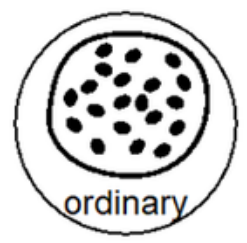
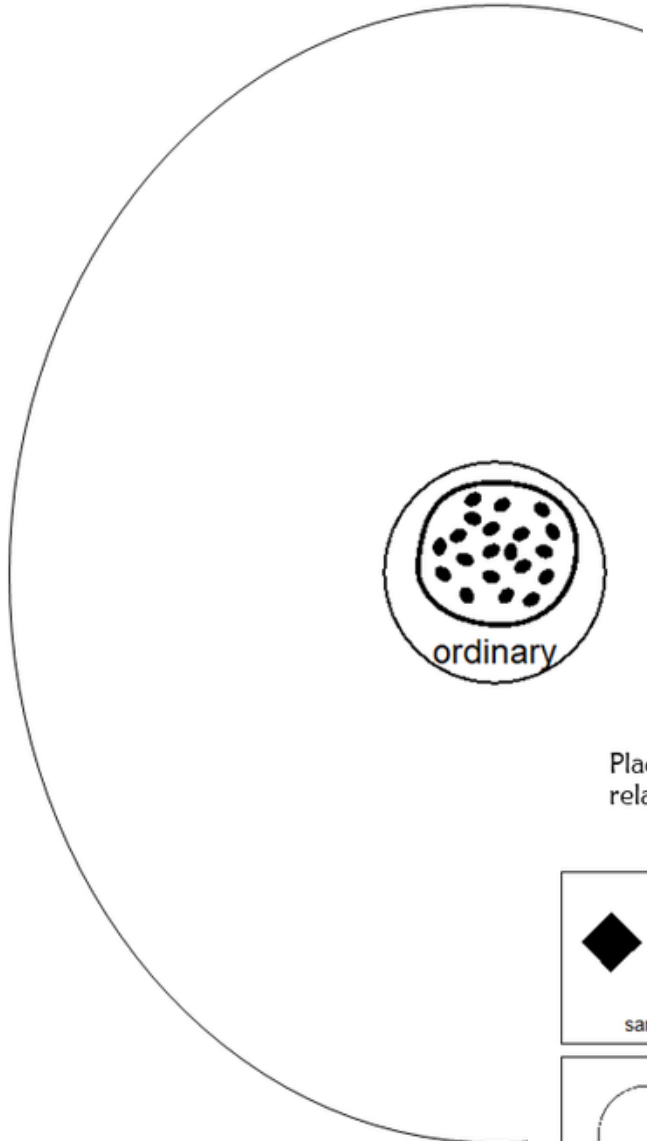
Place the pictures in the circle map on previous page **ONLY IF** you think they relate to a funeral.



There is a circle map of things you might find or feel at a funeral. There is an option that only has correct answers and one that has wrong answers mixed in.








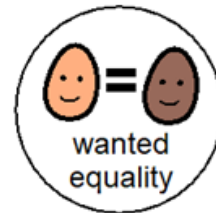
There is a circle map explaining what ordinary means. There is an option that only has correct answers and one that has wrong answers mixed in.



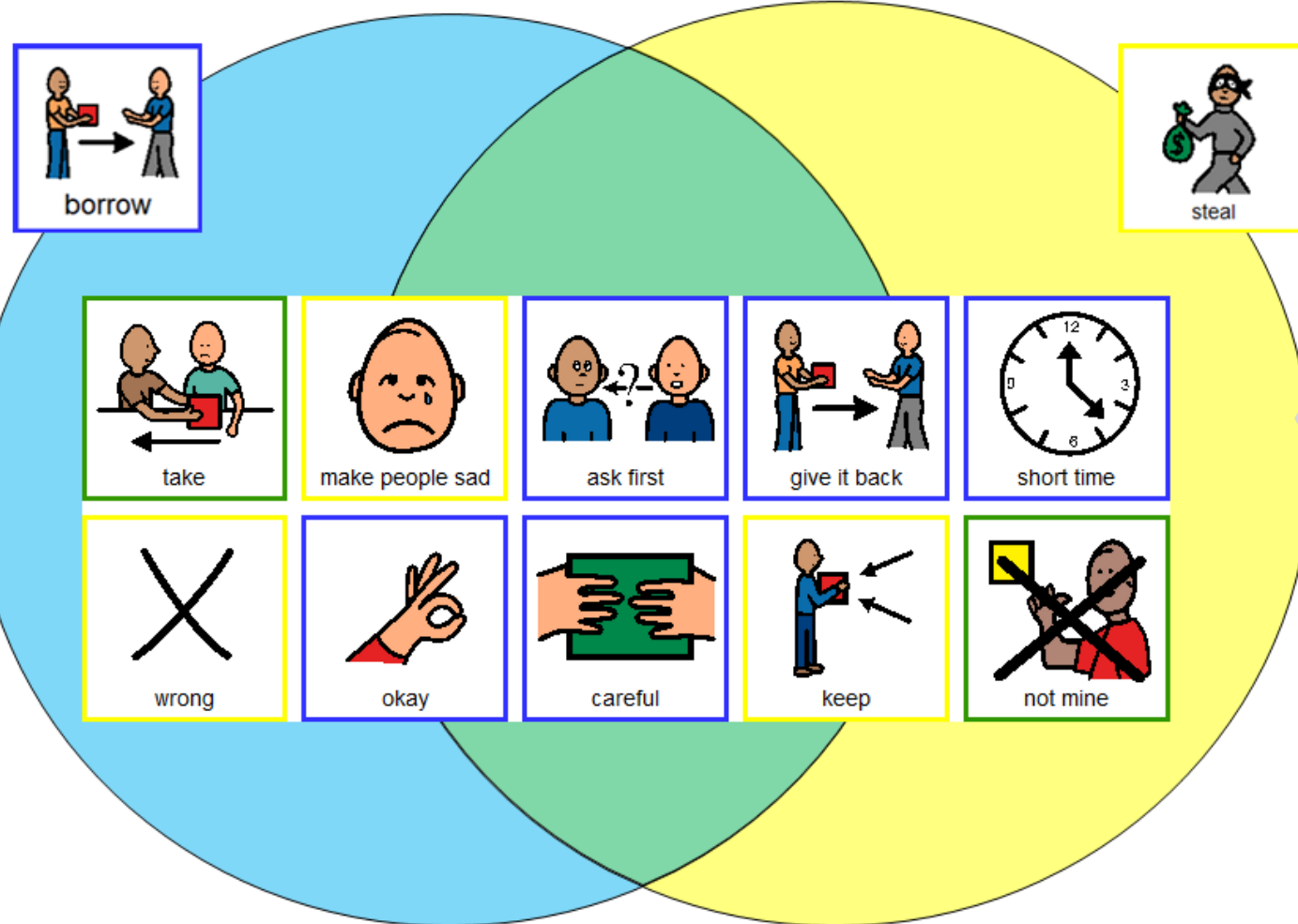
What made Dr. King a great man?



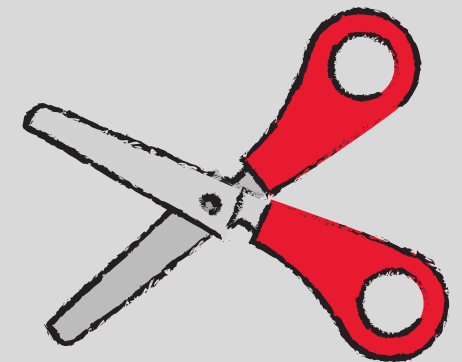
There is an activity where students will identify some things that made Dr. King a great man. This is an errorless activity.

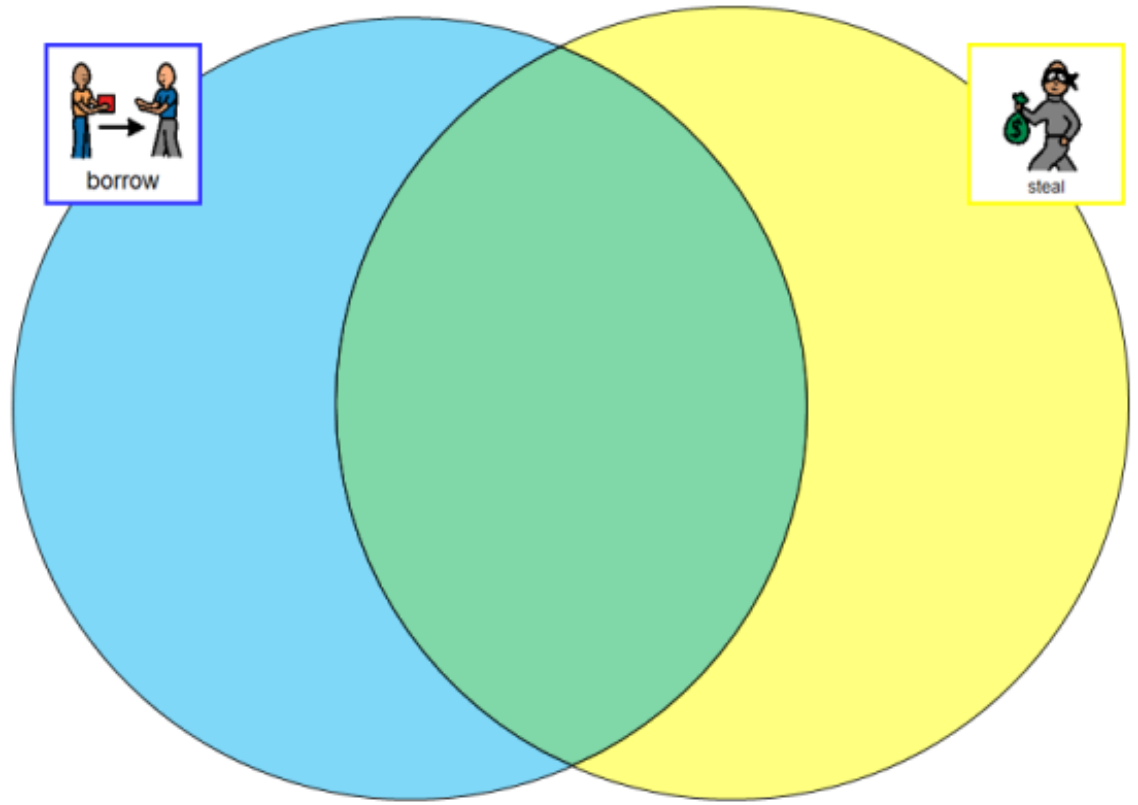
