Read or listen to the book: Alabama week 1 (10 minutes)	 Since this is the first-time students are seeing the book, I focus a lot on the pictures Ask lots of questions about what they might think the pictures mean or may relate to Make connections between book and vocabulary board (have students find relevant symbols on their boards to go with a concept or photo on page.) Go through the book twice, once just looking at the photos and a second time reading the story 	Book Vocabulary board
Vocabulary board I Spy Game (10 minutes)	 I play this game, or variations of it the first few days Since this is the first time playing this game, I make it easy. Hold up a symbol from the board, and have students find the matching one and point to it on their board 	Vocabulary board cut apart Vocabulary board
Circle Map (10 minutes)	Do the circle map on Alabama Choose the best version (errorless or not) depending on the learning level of your students Students cut out symbols and place in circle map. Make connections to the book as necessary	Circle mapScissorsGlue
Sharing (10 minutes)	 Each student shares their circle map with the group using the communication method of their choice This repetition is so important. Students are hearing the relevant vocabulary when: Read the story Review the vocabulary board Complete the circle map Share the circle map 	Completed circle maps Communication devices




















































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Each unit comes with a vocabulary board specific to that state.

The Talladega Speedway was constructed in 1969. Talladega is the longest oval track used by NASCAR and is 2.66 miles long. It can hold up to 175,000 spectators. Several races are held here each year, including a NASCAR truck

It comes in a PowerPoint version as well as an mp4 (movie) version.






There is a circle map reviewing some main facts about that state covered in the books.

- One has wrong answers mixed in students will have to set aside







There are several maps to identify the state, surrounding states, and major cities.

Differentiated versions are included.





























































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Students will sort resources that do and do not come out of each state. These are covered in the books. Suggestions for differentiation are included.








Match what each person is famous for on the previous

- · Give each student a set of Who am I cards
- · Various options/ways to play, but the goal is to have students hold up the card you are talking about. Sometimes there can be more than one correct answer
- Things you can do:
 - · Hold up a who am I card
 - · Show a page from the book
 - · Point to a symbol on the vocabulary board
 - · Verbally describe something about West Virginia.
- · Tell a story as though you were visiting West Virginia.
 - What do you see?
 - · What is the weather like?
 - · What plants or animals do you see?
 - Where do you live (city or country)?


Bingo cards



- · Included are 10 Bingo cards in color and 10 Bingo cards in BW.
- Place the cards in page protectors or laminate for long term use.
- Cut one board apart to use as calling cards.
- This is a great way to practice the new vocabulary included in this unit.
- · Cut apart a set of the vocabulary cards to use as the calling cards.
- · Options:
 - · Show students the picture for them to match
 - · Read the definition and see if students can find the matching picture
 - · Work as teams
 - · Vary the "winning" patterns.

 - · Vary the ways to mark the card
 - · Place in page protector or laminate and use dry erase markers


















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Included is a simple picture recipe that represents a food famous in that state. This will wrap up this 2 week unit.


